IDEALLY PRODUCES JUST THE RIGHT AMOUNT OF MILK FOR HER ONE CALF

SMALL UDDER

RAISES HER CALF TO ABOUT SIX MONTHS

USUALLY BORN WITHOUT HORNS

EATS ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY FORAGE



DAIRY COWS

VERY TALL

VERY ANGULAR

PRODUCES MILK

LIVES ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY INSIDE

OFTEN NOT VERY MATERNAL

ALMOST ALWAYS TAME

PRODUCES MORE MILK THAT ONE CALF CAN CONSUME

HAS A LARGE UDDER

CALF IS BOTTLE-FED, AND RAISED IN A GROUP PEN

PROBABLY HAS HAD HORNS REMOVED

EATS TMR - TOTAL MIXED RATION - A HIGHLY BALANCED MIX OF FORAGE AND CONCENTRATE
